Music Provision for Schools - Information Pack

Newham Music provides a range of instrumental teaching, ensembles and choirs. Our provisions also come with a multitude of benefits, services and support, including:

- Projects with high profile cultural partners, such as the London Symphony Orchestra, Urban Development, Guildhall School of Music and Drama, English National Opera, Drake Music for Disabilities and OperaUpClose.
- Showcases & performances at professional venues such as Theatre Royal Stratford East, Stratford Circus, Barbican, the Southbank Centre, Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park and Royal Albert Hall.
- High quality, DBS checked teachers who are subject to a rigorous quality assurance and training programme including regular CPD opportunities throughout the year.
- Nationally recognised accreditation through Arts Award, Music Medals and graded examinations through ABRSM and Rock School.
- Instrument hire service including individual instrument hire, classroom sets and short-term projects hire.

Our teacher musicians

- We recruit teachers through our close relationships with premier educational institutions including Guildhall School of Music and Drama, Trinity Laban Conservatoire, Royal College of Music and the Royal Academy of Music.
- All of our teachers are trained to degree level or equivalent.
- All teachers are observed regularly using Ofsted criteria.

Schools' CPD programme

- Termly training days featuring practical teaching ideas, sharing best practice and team-building activities
- High-quality external training opportunities with a range of expert partners.

What we offer and how it works:

Small Group Instrumental Lessons: These run as half-hour sessions for up to 4 students per group.

Large Group Instrumental Lessons and Ensembles: These are for groups or classes for more than 4 students at a time and can run depending on your requirements.

We offer the following instruments for individual, small and large group instrumental lessons:

Flute, Oboe, Recorder, Clarinet, Saxophone, Bassoon, Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Guitar, Bass Guitar, Voice, Piano (individual or small group only), Drumkit (individual or small group only), Percussion, Trumpet, Trombone, French Horn, Tuba, Euphonium.

Whole Class Ensemble Tuition (WCET): WCET is an Arts Council England and Department for Education subsidised programme that enables young people to access instrumental tuition as part of a group. A whole class of students can participate at one time and we also encourage class teachers to take part so they, in turn, can develop their own musical skills and use these in their own practice. We would generally recommend that a session take between 45-60 minutes, however, it is possible to tailor these to fit your timetable requirements.

We provide WCET for the following instruments and styles, although we are happy to discuss alternatives: *Ukulele, Recorder, Violin, Glockenspiel, Xylophone, Keyboard, Samba, African Drumming.*

Learning through Music (LtM): This music-based programme designed for EYFS and KS1 classes utilises songs, games, and rhymes to develop literacy, numeracy and oracy through music.

JAM – SEN/D and ASD Lessons: Based on our successful pilot programme in partnership with Drake Music, the LSO and Youth Music, these sessions are tailored to the specific needs and utilises string and percussion instruments alongside iPad apps to encourage engagement, social skills and emotional wellbeing.

Music tech: Using your school's existing equipment and resources including PCs, Macs and/or tablets, our teachers will introduce and develop pupils' beat-making, recording, mixing and composition skills.

Workshops and projects: Thanks to our many creative partnerships, we have an extensive range of ongoing projects and one-off workshops which we are able to offer to Newham schools at highly competitive prices. We have a menu of existing opportunities and are also happy to develop unique opportunities for your school's specific needs.

Continuing Professional Development (CPD): School staff are invited to regular training, networking and advisory opportunities from internal and external providers such as Drake Music for Disabilities,

London Symphony Orchestra and Arts Awards.



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Prices for Instrumental Tuition for 2019/20

Individual and Small Group Instrumental Lessons - £37.50 per hour

Large Group Instrumental Lessons and Ensembles - £41.50 per hour

Charging for lessons/payment: Different schools use different models, however, the most common model for individual and small group lessons is for parents to pay. In this instance, Newham Music can manage all administrative aspects of the invoicing and scheduling upon receipt of completed application forms from parents, however, we will always communicate clearly with schools. If there are not enough children in each group to cover the charges listed above, the school is charged the remainder. The minimum number of children required to cover costs is as follows:

Small Group Instrumental lessons: 3 students per half hour session

Large Group Instrumental Lessons and Ensembles: 4 students per half hour, or 8 per 1-hour session

Some schools may decide to provide lessons for free or subsidise them to some extent, using pupil premium and other funding sources. In this case, Newham Music in consultation with the school would invoice/not invoice as directed and then charge the school any remaining balance.

Newham Music operates ten-week terms and would normally invoice on that basis. However, if you wish to have more sessions per term, this is possible and can be arranged through the office. Additional sessions are charged at the same rate.

Whole Class Ensemble Tuition (WCET) and Learning through Music Pricing for 2019/20

We offer subsidised rates for WCET tuition through our partnership with Arts Council England and the Department for Education.

WCET operates on ten week terms as well with each session lasting 3 hours. For a year of WCET sessions (ten per term, 30 in total), the cost would be £3735 in total (or £124.50 for a 3 hour session). However, we offer WCET for the following:

WCET/LtM morning sessions: £2,200 per year for 30 x 3 hour sessions (ten per term) – a 41% reduction

WCET/LtM afternoon sessions: £2,500.00 per year for 30 x 3 hour sessions (ten per term) – a 33% reduction

*Please note that WCET Violin requires an assistant at an additional cost of **£37.50 per hour**.

Included in all WCET provision is an additional 4 hours of FREE concert support over the year (worth £166).

Workshops and Projects for schools

As the Music Education Hub for Newham, we are able to extend unique opportunities to all Newham schools through our extensive range of world-class partners. Examples are:

Newham Harmony – A Massed Singing Programme: In partnership with Stratford Circus and Living Song, we are bringing together 30 primary and secondary schools from across the borough to work with guest artists leading group singing workshops and perform together at world-class venues. The programme includes Arts Award accreditation opportunities, cluster workshops with 9 other schools, and training opportunities for class teachers. £300+VAT per year

Festival of Youth: This annual celebration of musical young people invites school groups from around the borough to participate in interactive musical activities and performances alongside professional musicians in venues like Stratford Circus, Theatre Royal Stratford East, and the Barbican Centre. Limited annual availability, from £200.

Interactive Professional Recitals: Professional and conservatoire ensemble members perform for school groups and explore the elements of music in fun and innovative ways. Opportunities vary throughout the year and are often first come, first served. Watch your email for new opportunities.

GCSE Support: We can provide specialists in all areas of the GCSE syllabus including both Composition and Ensemble Performance to support both pupils and classroom teachers. Enquire for pricing.

Eastern European and Roma performances and workshops: Members of our flagship ensemble, the Bridging Sounds Orchestra, create a fusion of world sounds with your pupils. From £450 for a 3-hour session.

We are also able to redevelop most of our provision to suit one-off workshops or short term projects for specific in-school needs. Common examples include iPad workshops, African Drumming Days, and Music Production Studio Residencies. Let us know what you are looking for and we can find a solution together!

Continuing Professional Development

Our highly successful Training Programme for schools includes opportunities for all adults working in Newham schools.

Termly Primary Network Meetings: Whether you are an experienced musician and teacher or new to the music coordinator job and looking for ideas about how to lead music effectively in your school, these sessions give opportunities to develop your skills and knowledge. - £30 per meeting or £75 for all three.

Secondary Network Meetings: Opportunity to meet with other secondary music teachers in the borough and share ideas and resources.

Bespoke in-school INSET: including music advisory meetings and sessions such as: *Composing in the Classroom, Developing Confidence in Leading Singing, Cross-curricular Music Activities* and *Topic-Based Music*. From £135 per session.

Out of school INSET: Our INSET sessions occur throughout the academic year and have included topics such as *Body Percussion in the Classroom, EYFS Singing and Vocal Development, Creative Music in the Classroom, How to Make Instruments Work!, Arts Award Bronze/Silver training*. These are often provided free of charge to all Newham teachers and TAs.
